Learning project for this week: Construction

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to plan, construct and evaluate / improve their creation.

- This week I would like children to construct something at home.
 - They can use any construction material or equipment. Such as Lego, blocks, Knex, Duplo, cardboard boxes, paper, bricks etc.
 - I would like children to think about what they would like to make and to plan by drawing and labelling.
 - They can then practice constructing and just generally explore.
 - Once they are finished I would like them to think about how they could improve it? Are they happy with it? Can you make it bigger / smaller?
